#### **NOVEMBER 2020**

**Outside Fishing** is quiet, not a lot of members are venturing out due partly to the recent poor weather conditions and partly to a perception that there are few fish about.

One prominent member decided to have a go one-day last week but was forced to abort the mission after overbalancing and taking a tumble in the process of launching the boat. Rob tried to save himself by grabbing the radio aerial, but it gave way and he fell, bouncing off the pontoon into the drink. That was it for the fishing trip and Rob was off for medical attention for lacerations and bruising and has been seen walking funny courtesy of a very sore back and a gashed leg that required some stitching.

There are though credible reports from savvy fisho's that there are plenty of Morwong about and some very nice Snapper up to three kg are taking both bait and micro jigs. The reefs are also producing some nice Nannygai. Flathead are hard to find with just a whisper of a few fish here and there but they should be turning up in better numbers from now on. There are still reports from up Merimbula way of good catches of Gummy Shark with some large fish among them.

From the Rivers and lakes: The wattle has bloomed and right on cue Dusky Flathead are coming on the chew. They should become more prevalent as waters warm up, fishing the drop offs on the run-out tide should produce results. There are some good 3 kg plus Taylor prowling about and some big Trevally with one 2.5 kg specimen landed. Salmon would normally be schooling around river mouths about now, a handful of scrunched up pilchard dropped into the tidal flow will find out if they are around. Not hearing many reports of Bream being caught this month but that is to be expected as bream is fish of the month and those who target them will be giving little away. The Bream may have gone a bit quiet following recent floods but will be coming right on the bite as waters clear and warm up. Southern black Bream will be moving upstream and are not put off by a bit of a fresh. There are currently plenty of Luderick lurking in the estuaries, some fairly decent specimens have been recorded in recent weeks



Lifejacket Law Anyone rock fishing in a declared location must wear an appropriate lifejacket. This includes people helping you to rock fish and children.

Failing to wear an appropriate lifejacket while rock fishing in a declared area may result in a \$100 on the spot fine.



#### Fish of the month for November Luderick

Here is a bit about them Also known as
Blackfish Luderick are essentially a weed eater
with wide ranging habitat that includes rocky ocean

shorelines, they love breakwaters and jetties and frequent estuaries from the entrances, upstream to tidal limits. Purist Blackfish anglers can be spotted fishing ocean platforms and break walls etc with long whippy rods, using green weed, cabbage or Cunjevoi as bait suspended under a light float.

Locally however, most Luderick are taken from the estuaries, all of these will be holding fish at this time of year, where they frequent rocky edges around the holes, banks or areas with structure, or shallower ribbon weed beds.

Your Bream gear will do the job and best baits in the rivers are nippers or sandworm, sometimes called bloodworm or squirt worm. The runout tide seems to work best, cast toward the bank or weed bed where the fish may be seen feeding. Luderick respond well to burley and a slow moving bait and can be felt to suck or chew on it before taking it.

Confusing species: (right) Black Drummer or Rock Blackfish

may be caught while fishing for Luderick off ocean rock platforms and

inexperienced anglers may mistakenly identify them as Luderick.





Confusing species (left) Zebra fish rarely caught while fishing from the rocks and can be misidentified as Luderick because of its distinct striping and sometimes bronze colouring. It is also sometimes mistakenly thought to be a type of Drummer. and have been a point of confusion in past March competitions.

Many estuary enthusiasts are anxiously awaiting opening of the Victorian border for the excellent estuarine fishing available in East Gippsland Waters as are many Victorians who regularly come to NSW for our ocean fishing.

The building repairs to our clubrooms are still proceeding with gutters having been replaced with the next step being repairs to some of the external weather boards before major works repairing the termite damage to the norther walls and cladding. Due to the engineering works required to repair the rock wall below the cleaning tables there has been some delays for financial reasons and additional funding is being sought.

I have emphasised the importance of the new tables being installed prior to our competition in March 2021 and he has assured me that they will be installed before then, even if some are temporally re located until funding can be provided for the repairs to the rock wall.

We have another outing coming up to the Bega River in Tathra and I hope that many of you can come along. A few of us are staying for the weekend and would love to have you join us.

Our next function will be our Christmas Dinner, hopefully at the clubrooms depending on how the building works are proceeding, but it will go ahead regardless so keep an eye on our regular updates.


