NOVEMBER 2020

Outside fishing: This was still quiet as the month began, a local doctor was disappointed that a rare day on the water produced just three Mowies one Snapper and a Pigfish. Now as we near November's end, indications are that not much has improved with water conditions not conducive to good catches. There are however still some good Snapper around North and South heads and there are still reports of Gummy Shark captures including some large ones. Best to go north a bit for the best chance of bagging some of these. Mowies have been around in good numbers and it seems still are. Most reports of ocean Flathead are from North of us but word of bag limits from just around from South Head indicate that they are lurking on our grounds.

Rivers & lakes: As predicted local systems have come to life as waters warm up. Wonboyn is providing good catches of Whiting, Bream, Trevally and a few Dusky flathead. The same can be said for the Merimbula and Pambula systems where good Tailor and Salmon are being taken in the channels as well. No reports from Kiah inlet/ Towamba River area but from experience this system will be fishing well at this time of year. Mogareeka is a hot spot for Dusky Flathead, our President may be able to confirm this after he and a group of members fished the system on a recent club outing.



Fish of the month for December: Sand Whiting is the fish you are competing for this month. This great little sport fish will be about in good numbers and of good size in all local river systems, lakes and beaches from spring through into autumn. Sand whiting can be targeted by bait fishing or by surface luring and there is a rapidly growing army of enthusiasts being turned on to the latter method.

Where to fish: Sand Whiting inhabit sandy areas within estuaries bays and coastal beaches generally at depths of 0.5 to 6 m. When targeting whiting within an estuary focus on sand flats during an incoming tide particularly the upper reaches of the tidal front and channel edges on the runout tide. On the beaches look for areas of interest such as shallow gutters and holes.

Rod and Reel: To get the most enjoyment out of your Whiting fishing it is best to adopt a finesse approach with a lightweight light line outfit. For protected waters go for something like 2-4kg 7ft graphite rod with a 1000-2500 sized reel to suit. For beaches choose a light 10 -12ft rod and balance with a 4000-6000 size reel.

Terminal tackle: Size 4-8 long shank hook, size 4-8 swivel

Rigging for bait fishing: Whiting rigs vary but a simple one that works consists of a size 4-8 long shank hook with a 0.5 - 1m fluorocarbon leader and small running ball sinker above a size 4-8 swivel.

Best bait: Live nippers, shrimps, beach worms or sand worms.

Rigging for lure fishing: Targeting Whiting on surface lures is great sport and can be quite productive. Use 2-4lb braid to allow maximum casting distance, joined to a 1.5m 4-6lb mono leader. Ideal conditions for surface luring the flats are rising barometer, sun in the face and wind at your back, casting up current and retrieving with the tide.

Best lures: Small poppers or walk the dog style hard body lures. For example Bassday SugarPen 70's

Sand Whiting are an excellent eating fish and this is the prime time of the year to catch them. Whichever method you choose targeting Whiting can be challenging at first but with persistence will come success and this can become addictive.

Rosemary-crumbed whiting with salsa verde



When it comes to the crunch, whiting is worth seeking out.

Ingredients

2 slices bread, crusts removed 50ml milk 6 cups parsley leaves, washed and dried 2 cloves garlic, peeled 6 anchovy fillets Juice of 2 lemons

250ml extra virgin olive oil, plus extra 50ml for frying

4 eggs

2 tbsp salted capers, washed

Salt and pepper

4 whiting, each about 400g, scaled and filleted, skin on 150g breadcrumbs

½ cup fresh rosemary leaves, roughly chopped

50g plain flour 50g butter

Lemon wedges

Method

Make salsa verde first. Soak bread slices in milk for a few minutes. Squeeze out excess milk and place in food processor with parsley, garlic, anchovies, lemon juice and 250ml olive oil. Hard-boil and peel 2 eggs. Separate yolk from white (reserve) and add yolks to processor with all but 5 capers. Add a few pinches of salt and pepper. Pulse until rough paste is achieved. Check for seasoning and store until required.

For the fish, cut each fillet in half lengthways, removing bones down middle by slicing either side. Mix breadcrumbs with rosemary and a pinch of salt and pepper.

Beat remaining 2 eggs. Dust each fish piece with flour then dip into beaten eggs and press with crumb mixture.

In wide pan, heat remaining olive oil and butter until foaming. Fry whiting 1 minute on both sides until golden. Place salsa verde in dipping bowl. Finely dice reserved egg white and remaining capers and scatter over top. Serve with salsa verde and plenty of lemon wedges.


