## **FISH Of THE MONTH December**

**Sand Whiting** 

They swallow their prey whole, as they have no teeth, and seem to have quite brilliant eyesight. If you intend to bait fish for whiting you need to plan your bait collecting prior to fishing and in general a session starts with bait collecting on the bottom of the tide and then you fish this bait on the run in tide as the water pushes up over the flats. Whiting fishing is always at its best with a fair bit of current flow.

Sand whiting forage for their food by digging with their snouts into the sand or mud on shallow flats, but they can also be seen actively scampering about in turbulent or fast-running water. Water moving over these areas helps dislodge worms, nippers, pipis and small crustaceans.

### **TACKLE:**

A light rod is ideal for targeting whiting, whether you are fishing off the beach, from a boat, in the estuaries or from shore in a river or creek. It should have a medium to slow taper and be fitted with a sidecast or threadline reel spooled with 3kg to 5kg line. Hooks should be long-shank from No 2 to No 6.

What size sinker should you use? Enough to allow the bait to keep moving and looking as natural as possible under the conditions. When fishing in the estuaries use a channel or a barrel sinker, as they tend to let the line move through the sinker hole much more freely.

**BAIT:** Bloodworms, tube worms, squirt worms, beach worms and sometimes even garden worms. Worms are the top bait for whiting because they are their preferred food. Some great success on pink nippers, fresh strips of squid or slimy mackerel, pipis, peeled prawns and mussels.

With all these baits it is important to remember the size of the mouth of the average whiting. Remember the mouth? These fish are suckers, not biters.

Make your baits small enough for the whiting to suck in and you will convert more bites into hook-ups.

### EAFC LOCAL FISHING REPORT: NOVEMBER

Amazing as it sounds southern bluefin tuna at the head of Twofold Bay! Local anglers were astounded to hook up bluefin tuna out from Boyds Tower last week. These fish are becoming more plentiful it seems but are usually found some 40km or more offshore. As the weather and waters warm, notwithstanding snow on the mountains over the past, we anticipate marlin to be on the prowl soon along the edge of the Continental Shelf

In Pambula Lake lots of good size bream, trevally and tailor are taking both pilchard baits and soft plastics. Good results from amongst the oyster leases using Bassday sugapen surface lures. Also good results from the deeper holes which remain salty while above the water is more fresh from the recent rains.

Flathead, Snapper and Morwong are on the chew beside reef edges all the way down to Green Cape. Australian salmon are also around, try off our beaches, from Tathra down to Aslings. Best near the top of the run-in tide early morning and evening.

It feels wonderful to be re-elected as your President after not nominating at the last AGM due to a personal illness.

There is still plenty of work to do as a lot is happening.

Some temporary measures will soon be in place to remove the existing concrete tables and install new tables adjacent to the current location. Temporary lighting above at least one cleaning table is planned.

It is believed that work will be commencing on the Eden Safe Harbour project which is extremely exciting.

A great night was had by all at this years' Christmas Party with over thirty members attending

A big thank you to all who assisted decorating the rooms and in particular Sue Evans for the great Xmas display and knickknacks including homemade chocolates.

Great job Eddie for preparing and cooking a traditional Xmas dinner which included entrees all followed by yummy deserts and homemade Xmas Pudding.

### **Hiring The Club Rooms**

Following changes to our club's constitution last year we are now able to hire our rooms to approved functions. Recently there was a wedding reception held at the rooms which worked out well both for the hirer and our club.

We also now have a permanent booking with ESSCI once per month and our club provides the catering for their evening meal. It's great to see our rooms being used more as they should be as it's a great venue.

### Annual Fishing Competition March 2022
