EAFC LOCAL FISHING REPORT: January

Ocean flathead both sand and tiger are active along the 25 fathom mark between Turingal Head and Long Point as well as off Eden. Morwong are plentiful try close to the rocks off Long Point.

Deep dropping off Eden at depths of 450-500m has seen some lovely blue-eye trevalla and ling taken. Some large tiger flathead have been taken at 25 fathoms off Twofold Bay and also Tura Beach. Closer in at depths of 16-20 fathoms good sand flathead are being taken off Tura Headland and inside the Boyds Tower reef at Eden.

Some big snapper have been taken at Haycock and Hunter Rock together with morwong. Gummy shark are available at reef edges. Best baits are fresh slimy mackerel. Australian salmon are coming from the beaches; try Dolphin Cove, Tura Beach, Haycock and Aslings Beach.


Dusky Flathead are really on the chew in Merimbula Lake, taking everything from pilchards to soft plastics and hard body, try minnows. There is a report from the Kiah Inlet, south of Eden, that the "golden grail" has been achieved with a plus one metre dusky. Pambula Lake is fishing well. Although good catches of whiting are yet to come. There are lots of trevally, tailor and dusky Flathead on the chew. Try around the shark hole and the upper channel. Use pilchard baits, pumped nippers and soft plastics.

Fishing in the Bega River is improving. Best results reported from Mogareeka where large dusky flathead as well as trevally and tailor are on the chew.

FISH Of THE MONTH February

Sand Flathead

Every angler wants the big fish but the Flathead are always plentiful and can be a challenge for anglers to see who can catch the biggest. Flathead are native to Australia and are one of the most popular fish for anglers. They can weigh up to 10 kilograms and provide good eating.

Flathead are typically found near estuaries and headlands that are adjacent to river mouths. They have a preference for soft sand or muddy areas. You can find them sandbanks, near rocks and weeds where there is a drop-off.

Flathead are available all year round. There is no closed season for flathead. The peak seasons run from April to May and September to October.

Most anglers choose to make their own flathead rigs. Rig specifics get determined by the location, size of the target, size, and type of bait, and other considerations including ocean, wind and weather conditions. Remember, we're keeping things as simple as we can. Let's not overthink it; the flathead certainly don't.

Very simple rigs are always successful when targeting flathead.

Flathead are voracious predators that will attack anything that moves, or doesn't move, for that matter. They're a bit of a garbage gut and take just about anything. If it moves, however, as a lure does, they'll smash them.

The basic technique for both plastics and vibes are to allow the lure to hit the bottom then bounce it back across the bottom on the retrieve.

As good as artificial's are, natural bait is still dynamite for flatties. Mini yakkas, poddy mullet and prawns have to be three of the best, but then even the humble old pilchard still accounts for its fair share.

If you miss a strike, stop winding and just twitch the lure as though it has been wounded by the strike. To the fish this will appear natural – flathead are suckers for it, nearly always going in for the kill.

With a great effort from Terry Carson and Robert Ross and Shaun from the Bega Shire the new cleaning tables now installed at Quarantine Bay they have been put to good use with many fisho's heading out to catch a feed. Unfortunately, the wind has not been stable but those who have headed out early have been coming back with some good catches of flathead, snapper and other reef species. We are still in discussions with the Shire to improve the lighting over the cleaning tables and the necessary repairs to the floating pontoon.

Hopefully when we hold our 44th Mini Comp on the Victorian long weekend in March this will also attract more holiday makers to Eden and support our local businesses.

Pam and Val have been working tirelessly on planning this event and we are getting close to being prepared for what we hope will be another successful comp. You may have noticed that our signage for the comp is up around town and sponsorship emails have been sent and our regular sponsors are proving very supportive with all fish prizes covered.

Shane our event's organiser has made further upgrades to our computer program for all the fish entries. This year each entrant will have their a QR Code on their entry ID card which will automatically identify them and register their fish automatically.

Now that we are into the new year we will need to start and plan some trips away so that we can get together and socialise and share our fishing experiences. Given that most of our members are retired we may even plan some trips during the week once the holiday makers have thinned out and caravan parks become more accessible. I have had a request from some of our members to go back to Bemm River therefore a date in April has been set.

As you may have seen by our Facebook page there have been some great out of waters entries so I encourage other members to send in their fish photos when fishing outside our dedicated boundaries.

Currently our club has applied for further grants one to resurface the carparks and surrounds at our club and another to refurbish the outside toilets. We are extremely hopeful that we will successful which will make our venue more attractive to our members and potential users of our great facility.

To give you an example as to what's involved when applying and executing a successful grant we have only just finalised our Stronger Communities grant where we received \$69,000 for the repairs to our club rooms from white ant damage which commenced back in 2020 and along the way there was endless reporting and verification to complete the works required.

It has been discovered that white ants are still active close to our rooms and the termite bait stations active and are being visited by white ants. Finns Pest Control are treating this new infestation accordingly.

Once again, our book fair and car boot sale was a great success so many thanks for all those who volunteered to assist set up and helped out on the day. Although a lot of work is required setting up and packing books away it's certainly a profitable way of keep the club funds ticking along.

Prior to the book fair we also had a club working bee to tidy up around the rooms, mow the lawns and burn off where we have been clearing some of the undergrowth.

Our seafood dinner was another great success with over thirty old and new members and guests present, certainly no one left hungry with an assortment of seafood and sweets.

Prior to the sea food dinner I showed those interested a few simple rigs and knot tying and although I felt it was fairly basic stuff we should not under estimate what members would like to learn from each other.

Some of our members have expressed the need for more information sessions at our end of months dinners and I would also welcome a greater input from some of our more experienced anglers contributing to how and where they target fish species and what sounder techniques, they deploy so that we can all gain from their experience. Thanks Wayne!

There will still be plenty of new ideas to be implemented and anyone who wishes to share their thoughts are most welcome.
